



Building a Legacy

Saint Luke's Muriel I. Kauffman Women's Heart Center, the first center of its kind in the United States, has advocated for women's heart health for more than 30 years.

Recognized as pioneers, the Women's Heart Center quickly became a leader in raising awareness of women's heart health as a founding partner of the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute's Heart Truth® Campaign, WomenHeart: The National Coalition for Women with Heart Disease, and as a national spokesperson for the American Heart Association.

Advocacy

In 2011, along with WomenHeart, the Women's Heart Center's leadership advocated on Capitol Hill for The Heart for Women Act. The Act, passed by bipartisan legislation, directs federal research programs to ensure clinical study safety; effective data by sex, age, and racial subgroups; adequate representations of females, racial, and ethnic minorities; and the participation of women of all ages in approved clinical studies.

Research

The Women's Heart Center continues to evolve. The Center's mission embraces a research vision dedicated to women's cardiovascular health, saving lives in the communities we serve and around the world.


The Center has used their influence to bring more attention to women's cardiovascular research by leading:

- Preeclampsia and eclampsia registry


