While the United States typically associates October with pumpkins, across the pond, the United Kingdom celebrates the 21st as Apple Day—an annual celebration of apples and orchards since 1990. In September, we welcomed Samantha Edens into her new role as dietary manager. For this month's nutrition article, we present fun facts of our beloved Louisburg Cider Mill.

This time last year, we took a trip to the Louisburg Cider Mill for cider and their famous Cider Mill doughnuts. We're making the most of this fall and our neighbors by reminiscing on fun we've shared together and making plans for exciting adventures in the future, while enjoying the present. As we take a walk down memory lane down the road to Louisburg Cider Mill—a few fun facts:

Emmett and Mary O'Rear purchased the farm in 1975 with two of the original late 1800s structures still standing.

Where the Country Store sits was once the original farmhouse of the 80-acre property. Before the Country Store was complete, the original barn served not only as the pressing site, but also the store. Since the inception, the apple cider doughnut has been the crown jewel of the Louisburg Cider Mill. Before the modern process, apples were mashed through cloth on a rack before they were pneumatically pressed. After the original owners retired and moved to Florida, they passed along their vision and mill to their daughter, Shelly, and her husband, Tom. While the experience at Louisburg Cider Mill has changed over the years, the one thing remaining is their love and passion for turning apples into a tasty treat and cultivating an experience for families and classrooms alike.



Apple Cider Cupcakes with Brown Sugar Cinnamon Buttercream

2 eggs

1 2/3 c all-purpose flour

1 c Louisburg Apple Cider

2/3 c sugar

1/2 c unsalted butter, softened

2 t baking powder

1 t ground cinnamon

1/2 t salt

1 t. vanilla

Cream together butter and sugar with mixer. Add the eggs and vanilla and mix until fully combined. Whisk together all dry ingredients in a separate bowl. Add the apple cider and the mixture of dry ingredients into the butter/sugar/egg mixture, alternating until mixed completely. Line cupcake tin with liners. Fill cupcake liners 2/3 full and bake at 350 degrees for 17 - 19 minutes or until toothpick or skewer inserted into center comes out clean. Let cool completely before frosting.

Resident Spotlight: Ardith Louise (Betty) Ryan



Ardath Louise (Betty) was born September 29, 1923 to Ross and Alta White. Betty was the baby of six girls and grew up in the Cola Hill school district, southwest of Burlington. Their father walked the girls across the Big Creek Bridge nearly every day to get to school. She remembers one very frosty morning deciding to put her tongue on the bridge rail—proving to be very scary for her and her sisters as her tongue stuck to the bridge! Valuable lessons

were learned that day. She and her sisters were always exploring and adventuring, and sometimes they’d catch a ride on the train to get to town.

Betty married Henry Hugh Ryan on August 15, 1943. They made their home on a farm west of Burlington where they raised their two daughters, Norma and Donna, and son, Kevin. She helped Henry in the fields as needed and later worked at the M&L grocery store on weekends and Burlington’s Peter Pan Store.
